SUBJECT: Weekly Report for August 29 to September 2, 2022

Both the House and Senate are in recess. The Senate is scheduled to return September 6. The House is scheduled to return September 13.

The following is a summary of our current Congressional activities:

A. Hearings at Which the Department is Testifying

1. **War Crimes:** On Wednesday, September 28, the Senate Judiciary Committee will hold a hearing on accountability for war crimes and crimes against humanity. Eli Rosenbaum, the Justice Department Counselor for War Crimes Accountability, and Beth Van Schaack, the Ambassador-at-Large for Global Criminal Justice, will testify.

B. Hearings of Interest to the Department

1. **Clean Air Act:** On Wednesday, September 7, the Environment and Public Works Committee will hold a hearing to examine legislation related to the Clean Air Act, including:
 - S.2736 - Recognizing the Protection of Motorsports (RPM) Act
 - S.1475 - Livestock Regulatory Protection Act
 - S.2661 - Smoke-Ready Communities Act
 - S.2421 - Smoke Planning and Research Act

C. Scheduled Briefings

1. **Unmanned Aircraft Systems:** On Monday, August 29, Section Chief Craig Donnachie from the FBI's Critical Incident Response Group, Chris Hardee and Colin Ross from the National Security Division, and officials from the Department of Homeland Security and the Federal Aviation Administration will provide a semi-annual briefing on countering unmanned aircraft systems to staff for the Senate Judiciary, Homeland Security and

Governmental Affairs, and Commerce, Science, and Transportation committees. OLA will participate in the briefings.

2. **National Incident Reporting Based System (NIBRS)**: On Tuesday, August 30, Amy Blasher, Assistant Section Chief of the Law Enforcement Support Section within the FBI, and Erica Smith, Chief of the Law Enforcement Statistics Unit within the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), will brief congressional staff in advance of the September 26 release of the FBI's *Crime in the United States* report. Briefings will be provided to staff of the Senate Judiciary and Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committees and the House Judiciary and Homeland Security Committees.
3. **Efforts to Combat Elder Fraud Affecting Persons Living with Dementia**: On Tuesday, September 6 at 3:30 PM, Andy Mao, the Department's National Elder Justice Coordinator, and Sarah Carroll, Counsel for the Office of the Associate Attorney General, will brief Representative Deutch's staff regarding the Elder Justice Initiative's prosecutorial efforts, programmatic and training initiatives, and victim resources. OLA will participate in this briefing.
4. **SCOTUS Threats**: On a date to be determined the week of September 12, the Department will provide a bipartisan briefing to staff for the Senate Judiciary Committee regarding threats to Supreme Court justices and 18 U.S.C. § 1507. OLA will participate in this briefing.
5. **Breach of the U.S. Courts Case Management System**: On Thursday, September 15, FBI Counterintelligence Division Acting Deputy Assistant Director Cynthia Kaiser, officials from the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, and Deputy Assistant Attorney General Adam Hickey in the National Security Division will brief staff of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence in a classified setting concerning updates about the breach of the Courts case management system. OLA will participate in the briefing.
6. **Domestic Threat to the Homeland Posed by Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS)**: On a date to be determined in September, Section Chief Craig Donnachie from the FBI's Critical Incident Response Group, Brad Wiegmann or Chris Hardee from the National Security Division, and Kevin Jinks from the Office of Legal Policy, as well as officials from the Department of Homeland Security, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the National Counter-Terrorism Center, will provide an updated classified threat briefing to staff from the House Homeland Security and Judiciary Committees concerning the threat posed by UASs. Donnachie, Wiegmann, Jinks, and the other officials will provide the same briefing to Members later in September. OLA will participate in both briefings.
