**STIPULATED FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AGAINST
DEFENDANT JOHN K. CANNON**

Plaintiff United States of America has filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunction against defendant John K. Cannon. Cannon neither admits nor denies the allegations of the Complaint, except he admits that the Court has jurisdiction over him and over the subject matter of this action.

Cannon waives the entry of findings of fact and conclusions of law and consents to the entry of this permanent injunction without admitting or denying that grounds exist for imposition of an injunction.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is accordingly ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that:

1. The Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1340 and 1345 and 26 U.S.C. §§ 7402(a) and 7407.
2. The Court finds that defendant John K. Cannon has neither admitted nor denied the United States' allegations that he has engaged in conduct that is subject to penalty under 26 U.S.C. §§ 6694 and 6695 and other fraudulent or deceptive conduct which substantially interferes with the proper administration of the internal revenue laws.

3. The Court finds that defendant Cannon has consented to the entry of a permanent injunction pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §§ 7402(a) and 7407 to prohibit him from: (1) preparing or assisting in the preparation of any federal income tax return, or any other federal tax return, for any other person or entity; (2) representing any other person or entity before the Internal Revenue Service; (3) misrepresenting his eligibility to practice before the Internal Revenue Service; (4) engaging in conduct subject to penalty under 26 U.S.C. §§ 6694 or 6695; (5) guaranteeing the payment of any tax refund or the allowance of any tax credit; and (6) engaging in any fraudulent or deceptive conduct which interferes with the proper administration or enforcement of the internal revenue laws.
4. It is ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that defendant Cannon and his representatives, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with him, are permanently enjoined from directly or indirectly:
 - a. preparing or assisting in the preparation of any federal income tax return, or any other federal tax return, for any other person or entity;
 - b. engaging in any conduct subject to penalty under 26 U.S.C. § 6694;
 - c. engaging in any conduct subject to penalty under 26 U.S.C. § 6695;
 - d. representing any other person or entity before the Internal Revenue Service;
 - e. misrepresenting his eligibility to practice before the Internal Revenue Service;
 - f. guaranteeing the payment of any tax refund or the allowance of any tax credit;

- g. appearing as a witness at any Internal Revenue Service proceeding when he lacks any direct, personal, specific, factual knowledge of the tax deficiency or assessment at issue at the proceeding;
 - h. manipulating testimony at any Internal Revenue Service proceeding or engaging in any other disruptive conduct which interferes with any Internal Revenue Service proceeding ; and
 - i. engaging in any other fraudulent or deceptive conduct which interferes with the proper administration or enforcement of the internal revenue laws.
5. Further, the Court shall retain jurisdiction over this action to enforce this permanent injunction and all other decrees and orders necessary or appropriate to the public interest.

6. Each party to this stipulation shall bear its own costs.
